Schedule and Activities- Friday night will be a 100th anniversary party. There will be lawn games. Saturday morning there will be an amazing race sort of thing. There will be various events, cook outs, and training opportunities in the afternoon. There will be a patch auction and chapter competitions after the afternoon activities. Scavenger hunt will precede the banquet. There will be awards at the banquet. There will be a Dutch Oven competition in the evening, and then a re-dedication ceremony.
